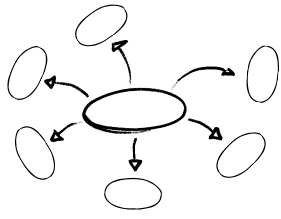
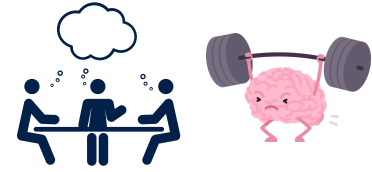


Whose Line is it Anyway?

What new information do we learn?

We learn the ghost saw the Pig insult the Wolf's grandma, which adds more to the story. The ghost also records the events for "GhostTok," showing how the Pig's behavior might look bad to others. This makes us think differently about who the "bad guy" might be.
